

# **English for Interfaith Dialogue - EID**

## **Background:**

English for Interfaith Dialogue is a continuation of The British Council partnership with Al-Azhar, which started back in 2007, to help building the English Language, communication and leadership skills of teachers and students.

Our work with Al-Azhar contributes to the British Council's cultural relations mission. In 2015, Sir Ciarán Devane said of the Al-Azhar-British Council partnership that 'Having a revered Islamic institution like Al-Azhar using English is invaluable and the British Council is extremely proud of our partnership.'

English for Interfaith Dialogue project involves scaling up our work with Al-Azhar and position the British Council at the forefront of cultural relations in the area of supporting interfaith and intercultural dialogue through educational programmes.



## **Objectives:**

Build knowledge and expertise in connection between language and interfaith dialogue through the research and development of English for Interfaith Dialogue (EID) training, teaching, and learning programmes in partnership with Al-Azhar and UK sector specialists.

Raise competencies of Al-Azhar teachers in delivering high quality English for interfaith and intercultural dialogue teaching and training programme interventions and position the British Council as a frontrunner in thought leadership through publications and conferences which highlight good practice in the teaching and learning of English through interfaith dialogue.

Embed EID programmes in the British Council – Al-Azhar English Training Centre in Cairo, and roll these programmes out in other Al-Azhar colleges in Egypt, other religious institutions in Egypt as well as other contexts where there is interest, such as Indonesia, Morocco and Palestine.



### **EID Curriculum:**

The new curriculum 'English for Interfaith Dialogue' was piloted at Al-Azhar English training Centre in Cairo to excellent feedback.

The content develops both English language skills and skills for dialogue.

### **Current Evidence**

## **EID Students Survey:**

**92.6%** are more interested in learning about other faiths and cultures.

**92.5%** can better use their English skills to engage with people from other backgrounds

**93.8%** value the role of EID in developing more open, understanding societies
